Guide – Agricultural Demolition Permit





Demolish an existing farm building including farm houses, storage buildings, barns, greenhouses, etc.

In order to building or structure larger than 10 m² (108 ft²), a demolition permit application is required. **Prior to demolishing the building or structure, you must be issued a demolition permit and complete required inspections**.



If the parcel is a protected heritage property, your demolition permit may be withheld in accordance with a heritage agreement or the *Local Government Act*. Contact the Application Centre for more information.

Did you know?

Protected birds often nest inside or under the eaves of man-made structures such as barns and other outbuildings. Section 34 of the BC *Wildlife Act* prohibits possessing, taking or destroying (i) a bird or its egg, (ii) the nest of an eagle, peregrine falcon, gyrfalcon, osprey, heron or burrowing owl, or (iii) the nest of a bird not mentioned, when the nest is occupied by a bird or its egg unless authorized under a provincial permit. Demolition of farm buildings has a likelihood of destroying birds' nests, so it should be done only when the nests are not occupied or following a nest survey to confirm that active nests will not be affected. WorkSafe BC

Before applying for a demolition permit, property owners should contact WorkSafe BC to determine if a hazardous materials assessment needs to be done. 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Submitting an Agricultural Demolition Permit Application:

Document	Required?	Description
Form – Owner's Undertaking (Schedule 2) and Authorization (Schedule 3)	Required	All owners listed on title of subject property must sign the owner undertaking and authorization form.
Form – Agricultural Demolition	Required	All fields on the form must be completed.

What to Expect:

Following submission of a completed Residential Demolition Permit application:

- 1. Delta Staff will contact the applicant when the permit is ready to be issued.
- 2. Review the conditions of the demolition permit, sign the permit and return to the Application Centre.
- 3. If applicable, cap services to the building and book the service capping inspection.
- 4. Demolish the building/structure and book the demolition inspection.
